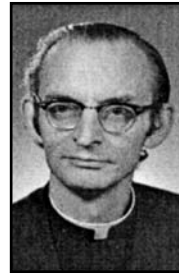

Father Kenneth Seberger, CPPS



Father Seberger was born July 28, 1920, in Schererville, Ind. He entered the Society of the Precious Blood in 1943 and was professed Dec. 8, 1939. He was ordained Feb. 2, 1946, by the Most Rev. George Rehring, auxiliary bishop of Cincinnati, at St. Charles Seminary in Carthagena, Ohio.

His priestly life was dedicated and certainly varied. After spending two years as assistant pastor at St. Brigid, Xenia, Ohio, he sailed for the Chilean Missions in South America.

In 1950, Father Seberger returned to the United States for medical reasons and had a lung removed. After his recovery he was appointed pastor of St. William Parish in Garden City with the mission at Christ the King, Deerfield. He spent several years in the Mexican missions of Kansas and in several hospital chaplaincies.

He then returned to Chile and worked as chaplain for the Precious Blood Sisters in Santiago in 1962. That same year he was appointed to the newly opened Peruvian Missions where he taught school at Villa Maria College for girls in Lima until 1978.

In 1971 Father Seberger was named provincial for the Society of the Precious Blood in Peru. He was stationed at San Francisco de Borja Parish in Lima, Peru, when he died from a stroke at the age of 60 on April 9, 1981.

A concelebrated memorial Mass was held at St. Charles Seminary in Carthagena, Ohio. Father Raymond Cera, one of Father Seberger's classmates, was the principal celebrant and homilist. Burial was in the British Cemetery at Lima, Peru.
